

FINAL ARRANGEMENTS.

FOR THE GREAT STATE OCCASION NEXT TUESDAY.

Details of the Exercises of the Day on Which the Corner Stone of the Confederate Monument Will be Laid—Programme of the Parade.

The committee of arrangements for the celebration in connection with the laying of the corner stone of the Confederate Monument and the reception committee held a joint meeting yesterday aft noon at the executive chamber, Gov. Elias Carr presiding, and O. B. Denson secretary. The attendance was full, and the session continued several hours. A report was made from the committee on finance which was satisfactory. The committee on platform reported the progress made, and said committee was requested to provide seats as far as practicable for the comfort of auditors during the exercises. The subject of the route was reconsidered and left under the control of the chief marshal, who announced it subsequently according to the programme annexed.

The committee passed the following resolution to which especial attention is invited.

Resolved, That the merchants of the city of Raleigh are hereby requested, to honor an occasion to justly memorable in our history as the Capital of the great State of North Carolina, to close their places of business from 10 a. m. to 2 p. m., of Tuesday 22nd, that all may participate in the solemn exercises of the day.

Arrangements were provided for a supply of badges for the guests, as souvenirs of the day. On motion the committee adjourned to meet again at 10 a. m., on Monday.
