man. Those present proceeded to organize the WORTH BAGLEY MONUMENT

ASSOCIATION, and the following ofl ficers were elected: President, Hon. W. M. Russ. Secretary T. B. Eddridge, Esq. Treasurer, D. E. Everitt, Esq.

Dr. Everitt, the treasurer of the fund, announced that the Morning Post Popular subscription has exceeded the sum of \$2,400. After a full exchange of views, it was

Resolved, That this Association will proceed, at the earliest practicable day, to erect to the memory of the young Hero of Cardenas a monument, in the form of a statue, representing an ensign in the navy of the United States; said monument to be located in Capsaid monument to be located in Cap-liol Square, in the city of Raleigh, pro-vided the consent of the General Assembly of North Carolina shall be ob-fained therein.

The Secretary was directed to enter upon correspondence with certain par-ties, soliciting designs for statue and base, with all necessary information

connected therewith. The meeting adjourned subject to the call of the chairman.
