## TO UNVEIL MONUMENT.

### The Confederate Monument Erected at High Point to be Unveiled on the Fourth.

High Point, N. C., June 24.—(Special.)—A very handsome monument has been erected here to the memory of the Confederate soldiers who sleep in the cemetery. It will be unveiled on the Fourth of July. Preparations are on foot to make the occasion a notable one. The program has been made out. W. R. Lowdermilk will be master of ceremonies and J. P. Redding, chief marshal. Mayor J. J. Cox will deliver the address of welcome. The speech presenting the monument will be made by Prof. Geo. H. Crowell; Rev. J. W. Goodman will offer prayer; Hon. F. C. Robbins will deliver an address "Dedication of Monument;" Rev. C. A. G. Thomas will make an address and introduce Col. Julian S. Carr who will speak on "The Confederate Soldier and his Monument." The girls who will unveil the monument are Misses Helen Snow, Mary English, Hattie Sechrest, Zelma Purnell and Vera Idol.

The erection of this monument is primarily due to a suggestion made by the High Point Enterprise five years ago. The Junion Order about a year ago decided to take the project in hand and did so with a determination to succeed; and have erected a shaft that commemorates the valor of men whose courage and patriotism have never been excelled.
