The Holt Monument.

The Greensboro Record has been shown the plans for the Holt monument to be soon erected at the Guilford Battle Ground. It is to be a handsome piece of work; the base is five feet square and two feet high. The next piece is four feet square and fourteen inches high, the die is to be three feet high and three feet square, surmounted by a cap fourteen inches high. There are to be three bronze plates costing \$185. On one is to be the coat of arms of the State; another will be inscribed: "Erected by Gov. T. M. Holt, 1893," while suitable historic inscriptions will be placed on the others. The whole is to be of Mt. Airy granite.
